



Cut costs and extend durability with breakthrough plastic

Australian street and park asset specialist Cosset Industries has launched EverTuff, a breakthrough extruded plastic product that is longer and stronger than moulded products – at half the cost.

EverTuff is a new recycled co-mingled product that marks a breakthrough in plastic recycling. As an extruded material, it is available in any length without the set-up cost of expensive moulds.

The Australian-made product is more hardwearing than hardwoods like jarrah or spotted gum, with a very low rate of moisture absorption. EverTuff has applications in all industries. These include the mining industry, for joists, bearers or dunnage; the marine industry, on jetties and pontoons; the agriculture industry, for vineyard posts.

Applications for the commercial building industry include bollards, car park stops, fascia boards, bearers and joists decking.

In the home, chemical and splinter free decking, retaining walls and new vegetable garden sets can be easily fashioned using EverTuff.

Cosset Industries, which is based in Adelaide, has received international interest from mining projects in EverTuff for high durability uses such as railway sleepers.

Cosset Industries director Andrew Townsend says extensive testing proved EverTuff was stronger than moulded plastic products.

In addition, he says, it costs about half the price as other extruded plastic products.

“For example, a moulded 200x50 section costs \$38 a lineal metre. With EverTuff, the comparable cost is under \$20 a metre.”

Cosset Industries’ mission dictates continual innovation that will ensure the company will become and remain a leader in outdoor elements.
